Summary of Pupil premium spend for 2020 to 21			
<p>Barriers to educational achievement that disadvantaged children face:</p> <p>52 children or 32% of our children received pupil premium funding during the above academic year. Some of our pupils in receipt have low attendance and the pandemic has exacerbated this. Some children fall into the category of persistent absence. Many families have struggled during the last year with food poverty and the school has referred more families to food banks and supported them with food donations during this difficult time. Some children have poor language development. A number struggle with reading fluency and comprehension we have tried to address these in-balances when assigning funds.</p> <p>Deployment of staff: Teachers and support staff are deployed flexibly in response to the changing learning needs of disadvantaged pupils. Resources are targeted at pupils at risk of underachievement in terms of low and high attainment.</p> <p>Our pupil premium strategy will be reviewed by SLT: October 2021</p>
